

Eric Fossum - "Pixel"

Yale graduate Eric Fossum was inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame for the invention of an incredibly tiny camera. Fossum led the team at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory that created miniaturized camera technology known as the CMOS (Complementary metal-oxide-semiconductor) active pixel sensor camera-on-a-chip. His team's goal was to reduce the power and size of a charge-coupled device (CCD) camera for interplanetary spacecraft. They accomplished this by putting all the necessary technology on one microchip, including arrays of light-sensitive pixels and circuitry that allowed for the processing of the data.

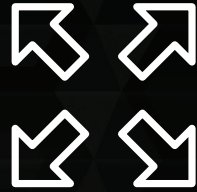

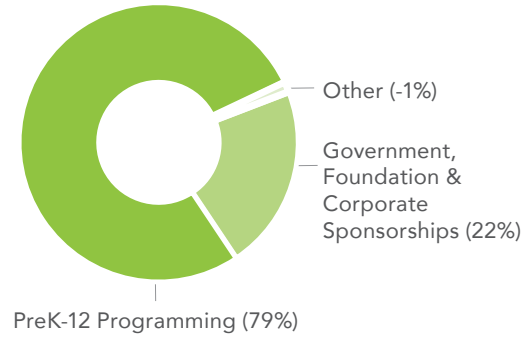

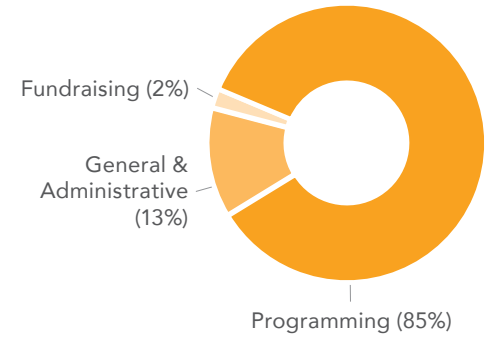
2018 Assets
